These questions include the recently announced **2012 Rule Revisions** along with some misunderstood questions from the current ISI Judge Certification tests. Please review all the new rules before answering the questions below.

- T / F 1. The duration time for Rhythmic 1-3 / Bronze events is 1:30.
- T / F 2. A Freestyle 2 skater may perform two arabesques on the same foot using different edges without a penalty.
- T / F 3. Synchronized skating Sr. Youth teams are allowed to perform sit spins.
- T / F 4. In the Silver Pair test, skaters are required to perform sit spins.
- T / F 5. In the Artistic Freestyle 4-5 / Silver events, skaters are permitted to perform an Axel / Loop combination.
- T / F 6. In the Open Silver freestyle event, skaters cannot perform a Flying Camel spin.
- T / F 7. When testing the program portion of a Freestyle test; if the skater fails to perform one of the required elements to the passing standard, they will be permitted to try that one element again (2 times) after the program has been completed.
- T / F 8. The duration time for the new Theater Production event is 6:30 – and there is a penalty if the team performs a shorter program in that event category.
- T / F 9. In Tot – Beta Solo Compulsories, there is no penalty given for the quantity of swizzles, wiggles, strokes or crossovers performed. Only the quality of these maneuvers is judged.
- T / F 10. Props can be used in Team Compulsory events – as long as no previous set-up is required.
- T / F 11. Skaters in the Open Gold freestyle event must include an Axel jump in their program.
- T / F 12. Layback spins are not permitted in the Open Bronze freestyle event.
- T / F 13. ISI Districts and competition directors can require coaches to be certified and judge, or have the option to purchase a Coach credential to put skaters on the ice for local, district, and national events.
